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### Overview

Edgewood High School of the Sacred Heart is a Catholic co-educational school founded in 1881 by the Congregation of the Dominican Sisters of Sinsinawa. Edgewood educates the whole student for a lifetime of learning, service and personal responsibility through a rigorous curriculum based on the values of truth, compassion, justice, community and partnership. Enrollment is open to students regardless of educational or religious background.

### New Schedule Beginning 2022-2023 Year

Beginning in 2022-2023, Edgewood High School has adopted a new bell schedule, allowing our students extended learning and enrichment opportunities during the school day to complement their academically rigorous course loads. Although our graduation requirements have not changed, the new schedule does not allow students as much room to take as many courses per semester/year as they have in the past. We encourage college admissions offices to keep this in mind when evaluating rigor in applicants' senior year schedules in comparison to EHS applicants from prior to 2022.
